

Storage of clipping or shearing blades

How to store our clipping and shearing blades correctly so that they do not get rusty when not in use?

To avoid oxidation and rust, please note the following recommendations:

For storage after use and with out regrinding

- After use, clean your blades with warm water and soap or dish liquid, wipe them off with a dry towel, cover them with oil then wrap in an oil soaked towel.

For storage after regrinding

- Before grinding, clean with warm water and soap or dish liquid, and dry them with a towel.
- After regrinding, cover them with oil then wrap in an oil soaked towel
- Store the cleaned, oiled blades either in an oily paper or an oily towel or put them in an airtight plastic box.
- Store the oily wrapped or hermetic closed blades always in a dry surrounding

Please note:

Do not use a wooden box to store any type of metal blades; wood always has some water residue, which promoted rust. Furthermore, we have different types of acids in the wood that also corrodes the metal of the blades. Even if you're oiling your blades after the shearing or grinding, there is always enough wet in a wooden box to pit or rust the metal.
